Greetings to members of Christian communities throughout New Zealand

It is less than 1000 days until the beginning of 2014, the bicentenary year of the coming of the Rev'd Samuel Marsden with Ruatara to Oihi, where the Christian Gospel was first proclaimed in this land on Christmas day 1814. Already an ecumenical group, the Marsden Cross 2014 Bicentenary Committee, has been formed with a view to planning appropriate commemorations of that event in 2014.

A programme is envisaged that will include events throughout the nation and throughout the whole of 2014, culminating in a Christmas Day bicentenary event at Oihi. There are three streams in the planning process so far:

- Events throughout NZ in 2014: worship, seminars, public presentations, a
  hikoi, information kits for schools and churches, and whatever else local

- A History Group preparing historical material is proposing a conference in the Bay of Islands 27-29 November 2012 (Contact Allan Davidson)
- Events surrounding Christmas Day 2014 at Oihi: we envisage an occasion where leaders of both Church and Nation will be present.

**How you can play a part:** it is our hope that in every part of the country local groups will get together to organise appropriate ways of commemorating this significant event in the life of both the Christian community as well as the nation as a whole.

The planning group is ecumenical, fully inclusive, open to ideas, and undertakes to provide resources to support local programmes. It is chaired by Bishop Te Kitohi Pikaahu (Tai Tokerau) and Bishop Ross Bay (Auckland).
