Organising an Alternative to Halloween Event – shares the experiences and expertise of lots of our churches who are running light parties and other alternatives to Halloween. We have collated their experiences and resources to help you do something similar and turn Halloween into an opportunity for connecting with and serving your community.

Kids Club – connecting with community children. This resource has been updated to include templates and stories from churches who run community outreach Kids Clubs. It is packed full of resources for a Kids Club outreach programme to primary school kids. Topics include: Connecting with community – the 5 w's and 1 h of Kids Club; planning and resourcing a Kids Club, timing, programming, co-opting volunteers, publicity, safety, prayer.
