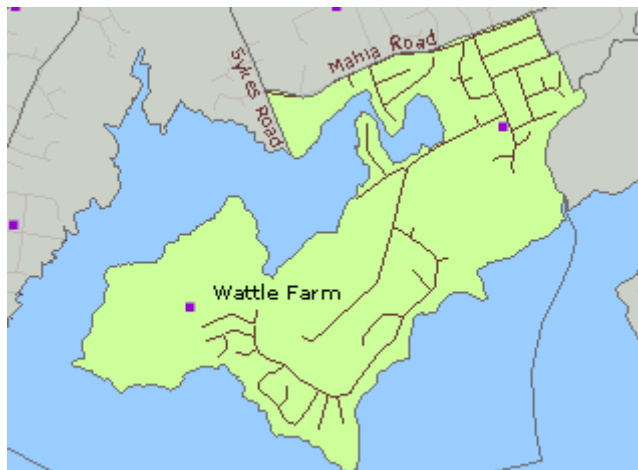

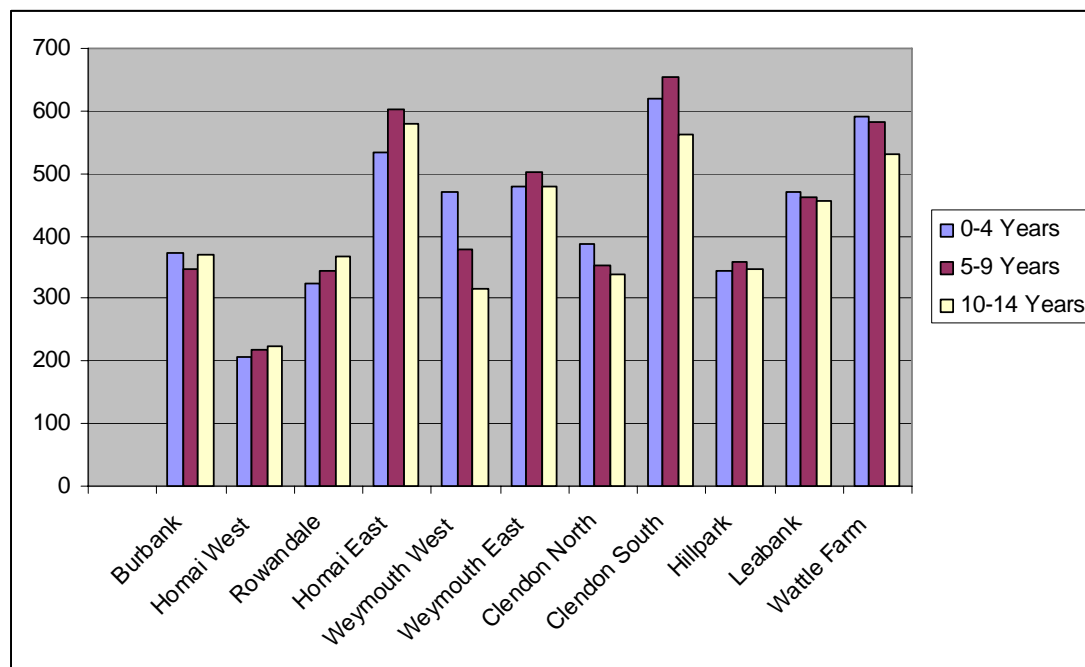

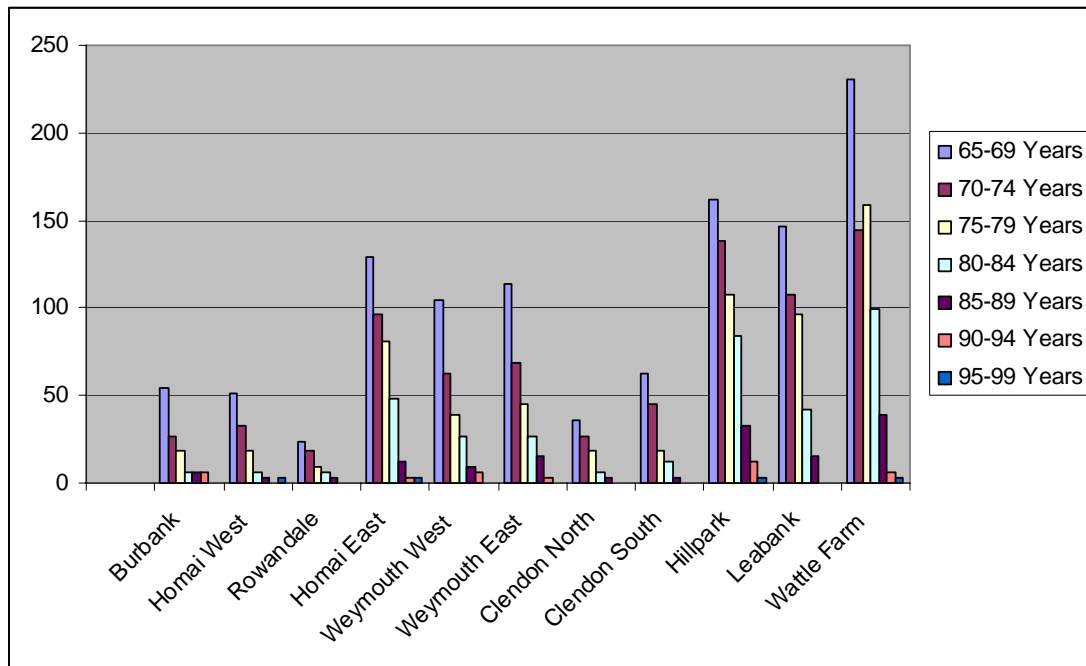

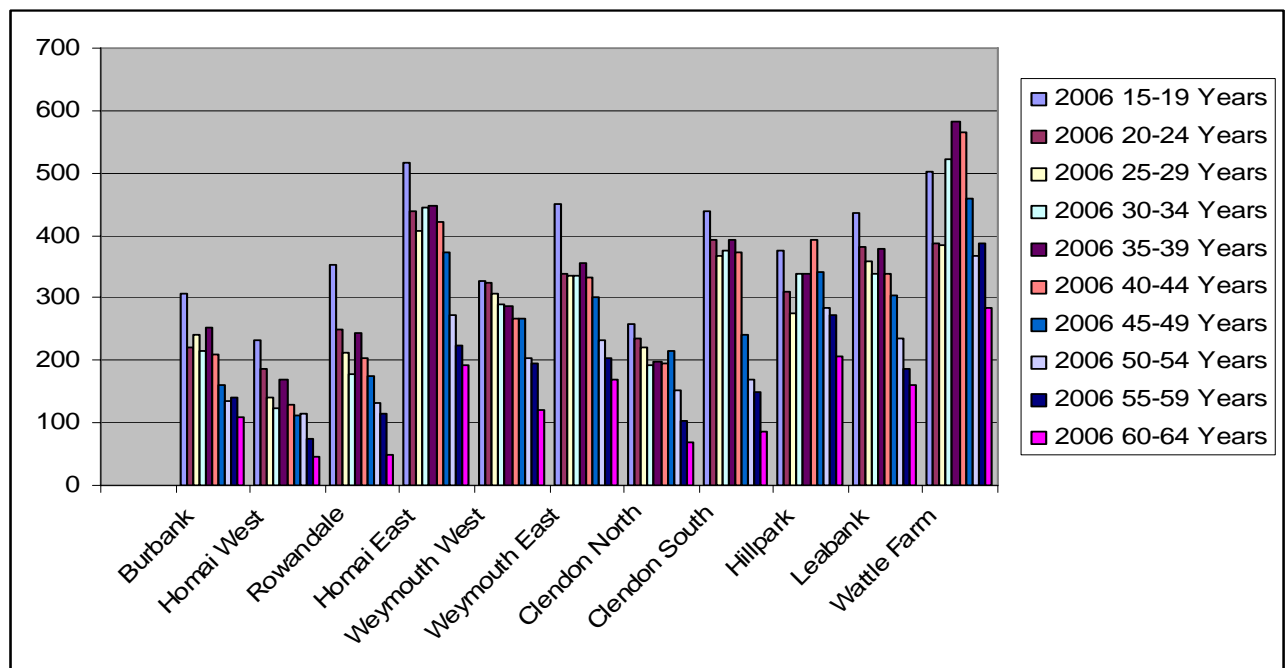

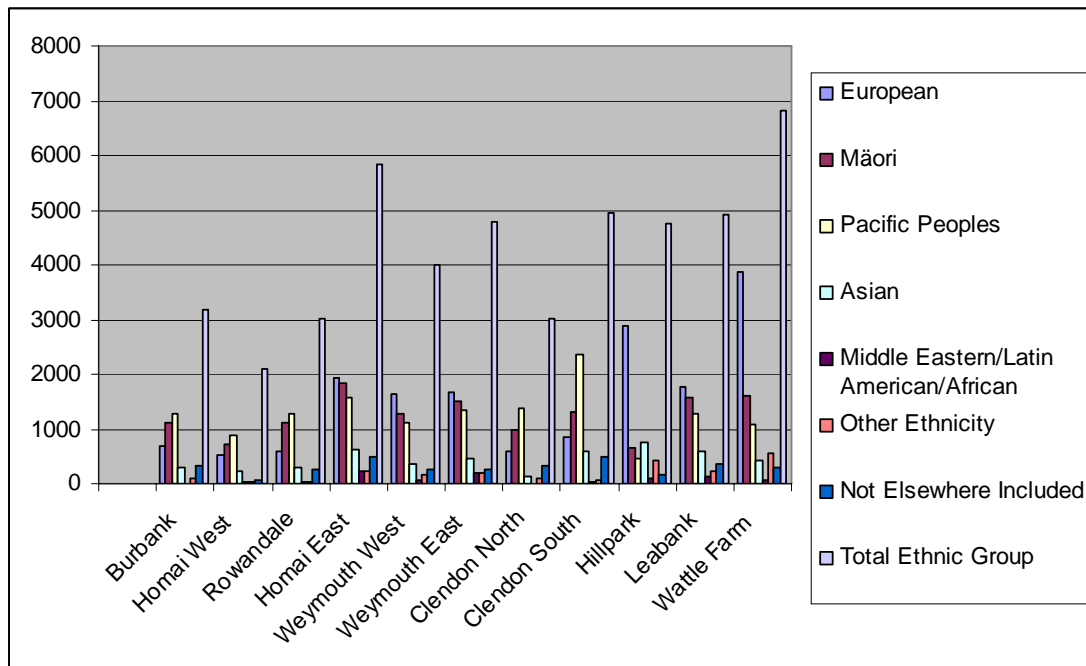

2. Fax machines are most likely to be in business areas;
3. Internet access in some areas is as high as the Auckland average, but generally lower than the Auckland and national averages;
4. Cellphones and the Internet are ways through which many people prefer to be contacted.

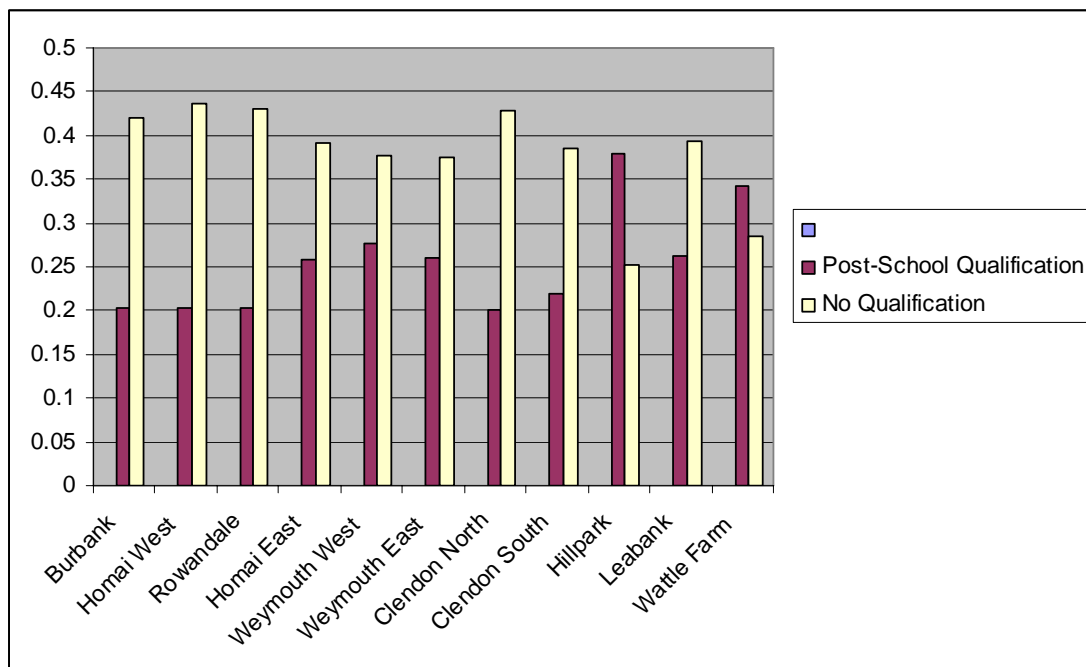

**By thinking about the Stats, are there *different* ways to reach your community?**

Think about:

- the high proportions of one-parent families;
- the number of people lacking educational qualifications;
- ways to reach young people (grandchildren) through the older people in the community;
- alternate means of communication (Internet, cellphones);
- ways to work with those on low incomes, eg, through bulk food buying;
- buddy programs for children without fathers;

**Other ways to learn more about your community:**

**Host Community Meetings.** Meet together with service agencies to find out about social issues such as:

- Lonely isolated people
- Youth drugs/alcohol
- Increasing number of people who cannot drive
- Grandparents bringing up their grandchildren, and other issues

How and where do people meet in the community: toddlers' groups, clubs, etc. How many community halls or meeting places are there?

Is there any industry in the area – how does it affect the area? Have there been job losses, cutbacks, redundancies? On the other hand, is there industry growth?

How many Old People's homes, private Hospitals, and similar health organisations are there?

How many primary and secondary schools are there, and what are their deciles (decile 1 being most deprived and decile 10 being least deprived).

*Note: National Mission Office can supply a number of other stats, depending on what is required.*
