She gives her permission for them to stay behind and return to their families. One takes up the suggestion, but the other, Ruth stays with her. Back home in Bethle-

hem, life is tough. The only way to eek out a living is for Ruth to take up the lowly task of gleaning. Naomi advised Ruth regarding the protocol of her new situation and trusted her to follow through.

The outcome of the whole saga was more beautiful than the bitter Naomi could ever have dreamed of when she set out for home. Ruth found her husband, Naomi was cared for and their place in history was greater than their wildest dreams.

Are we willing to trust God with the future of our organisation?"

The actual building started in 2011 and was completed this year. The church opens with a


central foyer linking through to the main auditorium, church office, cafe/kitchen, function rooms and a gymnasium.

It is now a valuable asset for the Community and also a focus for worship. Moderator Ray Coster opened the building and the community all sang praises to God for this gift.


