We extend our warmest greetings to all readers of the March–April TTC Newsletter. Although it is currently the school summer break, TTC has been able to continue its ministry uninterrupted, even under the intense heat. This is truly a blessing from God. We express our heartfelt gratitude to everyone who supports TTC through their prayers and offerings.

Summer English Class Ministry

After a break of several years, TTC has resumed its community service project, the Summer English Class,



which ran from March 2 to April 24, 2026. Over 160 students from Grades 1 to 12 enrolled in the program. Our primary goal is to provide high-quality, reliable English language education that is accessible to



everyone. To keep it affordable, the admission fee was set at only K. 3,000 per student, with a monthly tuition fee of K. 30,000. We also offered special

concessions: if three siblings enrolled, one was granted free tuition, and children of Christian ministers were charged only half the tuition fee. This initiative was spearheaded by the TTC Liberal Arts Education Dept. with lessons taught

by a selected team of qualified TTC teachers and senior students. In addition to English, the curriculum included academic subjects, music, and Christian worship.



2nd Session of the Certificate in Children's Ministry



The second session of the Children's Ministry (CCM) course—a collaborative program between TTC, Hope International College (Yangon), and the Hi Kids Myanmar Foundation—was successfully completed

at TTC from April 7 to 25, 2026. It is aimed to produce capable and reliable children's ministry teachers who can nurture children in the knowledge and faith of Jesus Christ, effectively fulfilling the goals of Sunday School. There are 23 students from three different



denominations. Some were sponsored by their local churches or their respective Synods, while others were self-funded. Students were also provided with scholarships based on their needs. Lessons were conducted by both TTC faculty and invited external experts. It is our hope that these students will find the training highly beneficial for their future work in childcare and spiritual leadership.

Artificial Intelligence (AI) Seminar

To ensure our ministry remains effective in light of modern technical advances, the TTC Faculty and Staff held a productive seminar on AI in the afternoon of March 12, 2026. The session was led by Rev. K. Lalchhuanpula, and all participants found it highly beneficial.

Training for students of Bachelor of Theological Studies in Mizo and Falam dialects of TTC Lay Theological Studies Program was held on March 14, 2026 at PCM Tamu. More than 23 students around Tamu attended. LTS awareness was conducted on 15 March 2026 during Sunday services in two Tamu PCM churches.

TTC New Badminton Court Dedication

The new TTC Badminton Court constructed with a generous donation of 500 Lakhs (Ks. 50,000,000) from TTC supporters Mr. Tha Kam Lo, Mrs. Vanlaltanpuil, and Elder Lal Hre Llan, was dedicated to

God on the morning of Monday, March 30, 2026, by PCM Moderator Rev. Zohming-thanga. In addition to badminton, the court is equipped for table tennis, thanks to a brand-new table tennis set kindly donated by Elder Tha Nei Khar. Furthermore, our dedicated supporters provided a high-quality solar power system,

including batteries and an inverter, to light the court's veranda. TTC is deeply grateful to God and our partners for providing such an excellent sports facility for the community.

TTC Farm Fencing Project

TTC's faithful and reliable partner, the Presbyterian Church of Aotearoa New Zealand (PCANZ), has been providing financial support for the improvement of the TTC boundary fence since 2024.
