- have good communication skills
- will commit to four meetings a year
- are able to liaise with our different and diverse members eg Maori/Asian/rural/ co-operating parishes/ younger women
- will liaise with the PI community and represent their viewpoint
- who can help develop our new digital communications such as website
- can assist the Mission Convenor with projects focusing on the Pacific
- can develop a PI scholarship
- have the organisational ability to manage a portfolio of work
- who will contribute to our goals

## United Nations CSW61 Delegation in March 2017

Letters of application with your CV are now due from those who have already expressed an interest, or those who still wish to join the PWANZ delegation to the Commission on the Status of Women CSW 61 in New York from the 13 to 24 March 2017.

The CSW61 registration process at the UN begins in November. PWANZ are entitled to take a delegation of twenty but may be asked to limit numbers.

PWANZ were the largest NGO delegation from NZ last year.

Delegates must be fully self-funded and have the ability to cope in the challenging environment at the UN as well as to have the maturity to deal with the often confronting issues affecting women and girls around the world.

Main costs for delegation members are flights, accommodation and a daily allowance. I negotiate a contract for hotel rooms near the UN for delegation members only. Enjoying New York sights, winter sales, or a show on Broadway are entirely optional!

Representatives of Member States, UN entities, and ECOSOC-accredited non-governmental organisations (NGOs) from all regions of the world attend the session.

The CSW61 **Priority theme** is 'Women's economic empowerment in the changing world of work' and the **Review theme** is 'Challenges and achievements in the implementation of the Millennium Development Goals for women and girls.'

## Mission Update

Change Makers Refugee Forum in Wellington provides volunteers to teach driving skills to refugee woman. The programme came from discussions from women who said that getting their drivers licence was their top priority towards living their lives like other New Zealand women. The volunteer is trained in guiding a learner driver and working with a woman who is from a non-English speaking background. The project has been operating for the last three years and supports 21 women each year. PWANZ will provide the fees

and costs for one of these women to gain her full drivers licence.

## Presbyterian Women – Funding Update

As at 30 September 2016, the end of the first quarter of the new financial year ended 30 June 2017; over two hundred members have paid their affiliation fees. These contributions to PWANZ accounting now for over \$1,500 in membership plus almost \$9,500 gifted to mission. Contributions have been recorded from eighteen groups, two Presbyterials and twelve individual members.
