The Synod of Otago and Southland currently employs Erin full time as its Mission Advisor. The Synod recognise that her work as Coordinator will enhance her work as Mission Advisor and has generously agreed to gift that work time as Coordinator to PWANZ during the transition period. Erin lists her strengths as communication, strategic, self-awareness, a relator and futuristic. She completed her Diploma of Ministry, at Knox Centre for Ministry and Leadership in 2013-2014. Prior to that she graduated with a Batchelor of Theology, University of Otago – with a major in Christian Thought and History, 2010- 2012.

Before becoming a fulltime Mum Erin was a Business Analyst for a Bank. Erin has had experience in: Establishing

a Children's programme over two years as part of Sunday the outcome being 60 children attended; Event Management; Introducing Bible in Schools to Outram School; Leadership with youth; a passion for netball including completing the NZ Netball Coaching Course and enjoys watching and being



involved in coaching and umpiring Netball. Family is important to Erin and when time permits she enjoys reading.

In March of this year, Erin was part of the PW delegation to New York to attend the UN Commission on the Status of Women Conference which she says opened her eyes to the plight of too many women around the world. From Erin: It is interesting how God works. In this case I saw the role of Coordinator advertised late last year. People around me suggested I apply. 'What me? (I thought) surely there are others with way more to offer'. Over the following months the vacant role stayed in my mind. My time in New York was profound from a personal level and also a faith and professional level. I came home with a deeper sense of call to participate in the movements of women both in our church and in our communities. I think transitionally (there will be some of you reading that will understand what I mean) and so here I am, wanting to help in ways available to help PWANZ find their next chapter as a mission of the wider church. On a personal note — I started life in Gisborne, but over the years have lived in the capital, in Auckland, further north in Kaitaia, in Central Otago, in Dunedin and am now in South Otago. I am 24 years married to Rob who is also a minister of the Presbyterian Church, currently called to lead the parish of St Andrews in Balclutha. We have three children, Emma who is in her twenties living and working in Dunedin, Noah, 18, who lives with us in Balclutha and Kate who is finishing her last two years of school in Cromwell. Life is busy and full and I am daily in awe of the journey God has us on.

Presbyterian Women - Funding Update

This financial year, in the eleven months up to 31 May 2016, five hundred and ninety-five (595) members have paid their affiliation fees and some with "freewill" donations. United Nations - News Clips

Ministry for Women Draft Eighth CEDAW Report (2015)

Presbyterian Women Aotearoa New Zealand commented on the Draft Eighth Convention on the Elimination of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW) Report. The Convention was signed thirty two years ago by the NZ Government. The full draft document can be found on the Ministry for Women web site www.women.govt.nz. We noted that the response time for this draft report was during the very busy lead up to Christmas after many groups had finished meeting for the year and included the Christmas and New Year public holidays when many people take January annual or extended leave. This short time frame gave us, as Presbyterian Women of Aotearoa New Zealand insufficient time to consult all our members to ensure a comprehensive response. The response will be attached to our United Nations Quadrennial report and sent to the relevant United Nations committees and used in discussions in NZ contexts.

Ministry for Women International Caucus meeting - May 2016

Two international caucus meeting are held during the year - before and following the Commission on the Status of Women at the United Nations. NGO's and other key stakeholders gather in Wellington for a two hour meeting to hear progress reports from the Ministry for Women, MFAT and Government officials. These meetings are very well attended but little time is given for feedback of key stakeholders. Carol Grant represented PWANZ.

Annabelle is one of the 2015 PW delegation members to UN CSW59 who has come one step closer to her dream after being selected by the Royal Society of New Zealand to attend the Summer Research School in Bulgaria in July. Annabelle is 17 years old and hopes to collect radio waves emitted from Jupiter and analyze them during the summer school. One day she would like to build rovers for NASA to explore other planets.

Congratulations to Suzanne Bishop and her Young Enterprise Pink Ladies Team at Columba College.

Suzanne was a member of the CSW 60 delegation and her Columba College Young Enterprise Team also includes Caroline Moratti, a member of the 2015 CSW 59 delegation to the UN. The group of enterprising Columba College pupils hopes masses of meringue pink pavlovas will make masses of money for the New Zealand Breast Cancer Foundation. Fifteen girls from the Year 13 Economics class have been taking part in Young Enterprise, an annual nationwide scheme where pupils form a company to sell a product for about 9 months. But this is no schoolyard cake stall! By July 1st the pink pavlova will be in all Countdown supermarkets - they aim to sell 40,000 pavlovas in the next 4 months. United Nations Commission on the Status of Women CSW61

Expressions of interest are already being received for the PW delegation to New York in 2017. The sixty-first session of the **Commission on the Status of Women** will take place at the United Nations Headquarters in New York from **13 to 24 March 2017.** Representatives of Member States, UN entities, and ECOSOC-accredited non-governmental organizations (NGOs) from all regions of the world are invited to attend the session.

Priority theme:

Women's economic empowerment in the changing world of work

Review theme:

Challenges and achievements in the implementation of the Millennium Development Goals for women and girls (agreed conclusions of the fifty-eighth session)

Local Government Elections

Elections of members of local authorities are held once every three years, on the second Saturday in October. The next elections will be held on 8 October 2016.

You, your group or church could discuss what is important in your area and consider standing for council or health board, supporting a candidate or attending or hosting a meeting of candidates. If we don't participate we can't complain when councils don't know what the community is thinking.

Key dates: 27 June 2016	Electoral Commission enrolment campaign starts.
15 July	Nominations open for candidates. Nominations have to be sent to the electoral officer for the council, district health board or licensing trust.
12 August	Nominations close at 12 noon. Rolls close. After this date, you can still vote with a 'special vote'.
17 August	Election date and candidates' names publicised by electoral officers.
16-21 September	Voting documents delivered to households. Electors can post the documents back to electoral officers as soon as they have voted.
8 October	Polling day — The voting documents must be at the council before voting closes at 12 noon. Preliminary results (i.e. once all 'ordinary' votes are counted) will be available as soon as possible afterwards.
