Little Children Are Brought to Jesus

¹³ People were bringing little children to Jesus. They wanted him to place his hands on them to bless them. But the disciples told them to stop. ¹⁴ When Jesus saw this, he was angry. He said to his disciples, "Let the little children come to me. Don't keep them away. God's kingdom belongs to people like them." ¹⁵ What I'm about to tell you is true. Anyone who will not receive God's kingdom like a little child will never enter it." ¹⁶ Then he took the children in his arms. He placed his hands on them to bless them.

²⁸ Then Peter spoke up, "We have left everything to follow you!"

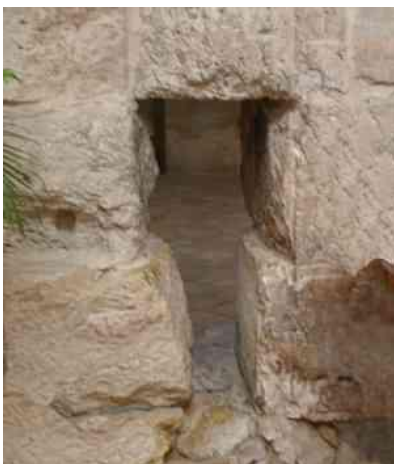
²⁹ "What I'm about to tell you is true," Jesus replied. "Has anyone left home or family or fields for me and the good news? ³⁰ They will receive 100 times as much in this world. They will have homes and families and fields. But they will also be treated badly by others. In the world to come they will live forever. ³¹ But many who are first will be last. And the last will be first."

³² They were on their way up to Jerusalem. Jesus was leading the way. The disciples were amazed. Those who followed were afraid. Again Jesus took the 12 disciples to one side. He told them what was going to happen to him. ³³ "We are going up to Jerusalem," he said. "The Son of Man will be handed over to the chief priests and the teachers of the law. They will sentence him to death. Then they will hand him over to the Gentiles. ³⁴ They will make fun of him and spit on him. They will whip him and kill him. Three days later he will rise from the dead!"

Background for the Teacher:



Interesting Note: The "Eye of the Needle" is a gate in Jerusalem. (pictured left)

A man would have to dismount his camel (sign of wealth) before passing through this gate. (It was used at times when the main gates were closed.) Could this be the reference Jesus was using in verse 24?

Another note: Look at the paragraphs before this story and after. Before (highlighted in yellow): Jesus talks about entering the Kingdom of God as a child (humble, admitting need).

After (highlighted in green): Jesus talks about his own upcoming death (the ultimate sacrifice...much more than giving up money or other forms of wealth).

Open and write, "...Your heart will be where your riches are."

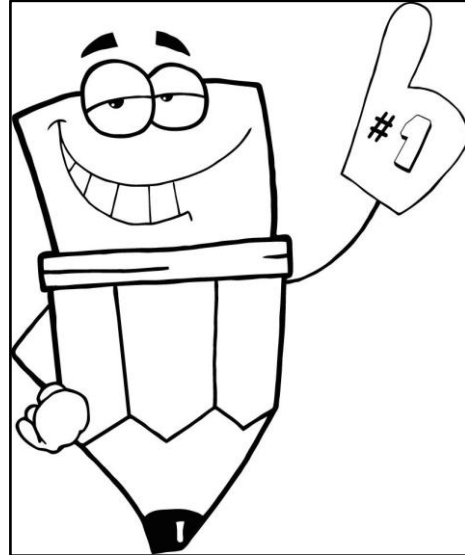

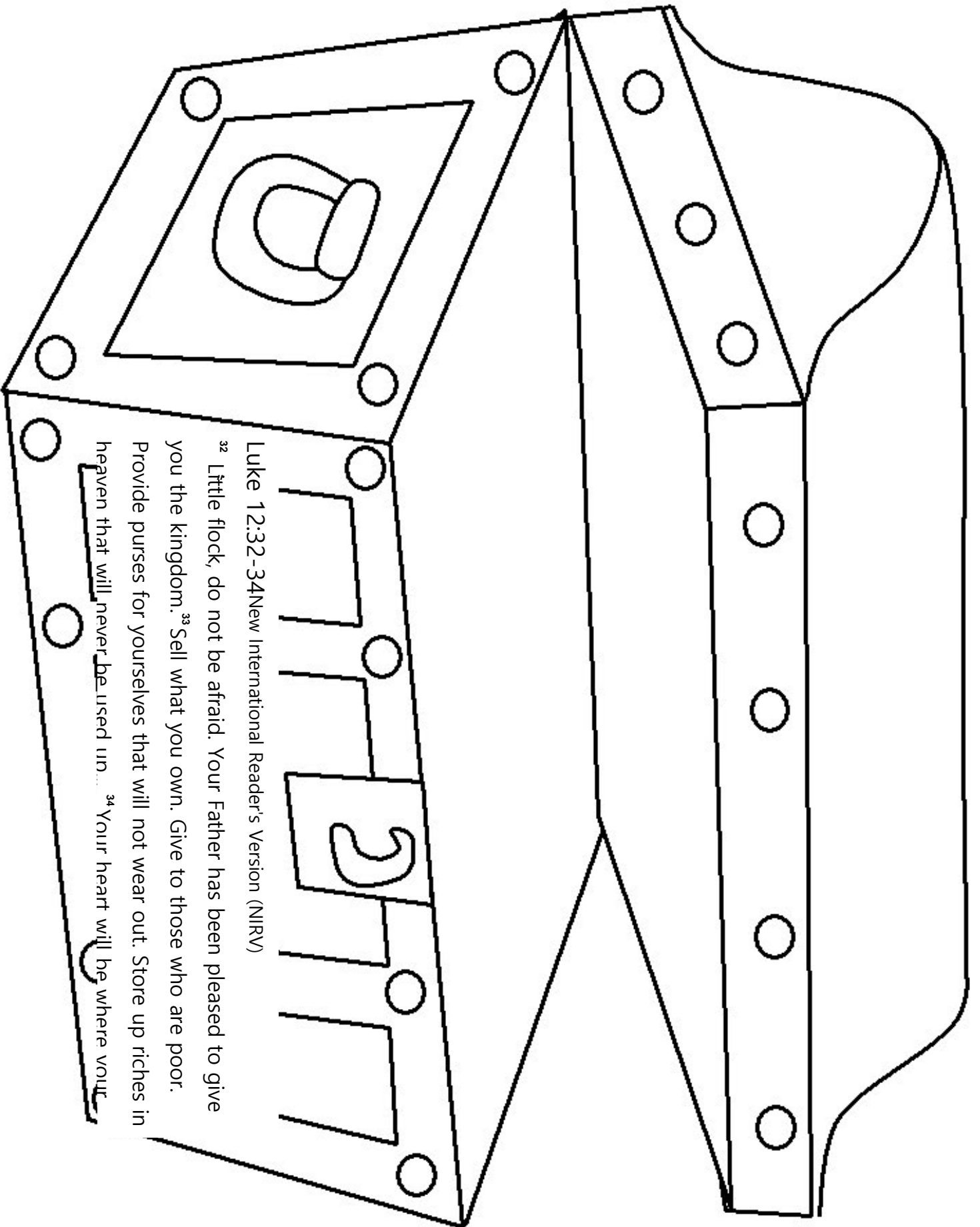
