General Secretary's Message FOR CWM SUNDAY 2023

Every year, the global CWM community commemorates CWM Sunday, on a Sunday close to July 18. This day marks the inauguration of the Council for World Mission (CWM) with its renewed missional ethos based on partnership. The Council was an attempt to de-colonising the former ways of doing mission, equalising the participation of all the members, and ensuring a mutual sharing of people, knowledge, and resources in God's mission. Although the history of the CWM goes back to 1795 with its roots in the London Missionary Society (LMS), we commemorate the day of CWM's rebirth on 18 July 1977, beginning a new era of CWM mission. When the members stood at the communion table in City Temple in London and said, "We have agreed to participate in this new Council and commit ourselves to the work together," they promised to share their resources of money, people, skills, and insights globally to carry out God's mission locally.

From then, every year, we commemorate the CWM Sunday celebrating the restructured CWM as a community of churches in mission where equal partners empower one another as authentic, creative, and interdependent missional churches. This year, we celebrate the 46th Anniversary with the Theme: "Break down the Walls of Division."

In the midst of a deeply divided world, the theme is a missional calling that we need to set our differences aside, overcome the enmities, destroy the hostilities, and "rise to life" together against the systems and structures that destroy peace and life in our communities. The vision of Apostle Paul in Ephesians 2:14, "For he himself is our peace, who has made the two groups one and has destroyed the barrier, the dividing wall of hostility," is that God called us as a new reconciled humanity. We are called to be the community of peace and reconciliation, healing the wounds and transcending the earthly barriers of hostilities and divisions. The power of love, reconciliation, and unity in Christ can overcome hatred and division.

Like every year, this year also, we would like to assist the member churches with the liturgy prepared by our management team and other relevant material to celebrate the CWM Sunday. We welcome you to translate this short liturgy into your languages and use it for the glory of God.

May you be richly blessed as you celebrate together the CWM Sunday.

Agape Hospital Project




As we celebrate CWM Sunday, we plan to send the offerings collected from all the CWM communities to the PCM for its Agape Hospital Project.

Established by the Presbyterian Church in Myanmar (PCM), Agape Hospital's mission is to provide basic healthcare and make health services more accessible to the community in Chin State, which is under-served by medical facilities. On top of mobile clinics, it also provides scholarships to produce quality medical personnel. To date, over 10,000 out-patients, and over 1,000 inpatients have received healthcare from May to August this year, and it is now in need of a relocation due to the growing number of patients and lack of infrastructure for providing medical care to the patients.

This long-awaited project of PCM involves a 6-acre plot at the Children Development Centre compound allocated by the PCM General Assembly, and the re-location is necessary as the hospital faces space constraints at its current location. In addition, further development and upgrading of hospital staff through degree courses and internships is necessary, as well as the acquiring of new medical and hospital equipment. The construction of the new hospital will also require layout planning, blueprinting, and funding.
