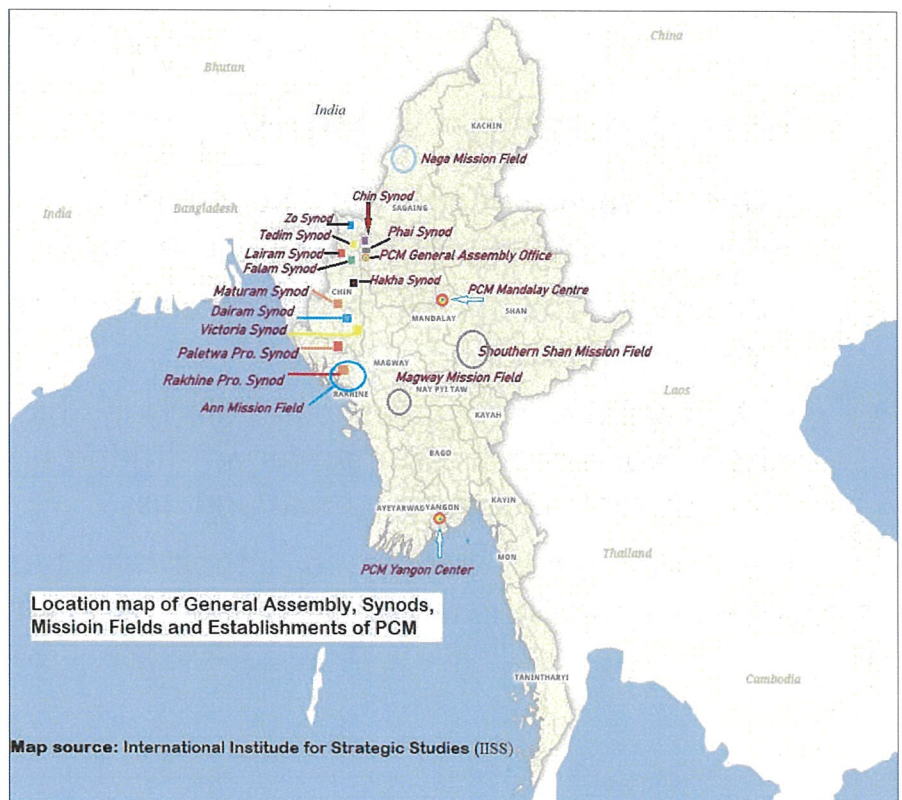

4. 2025 - Earthquake

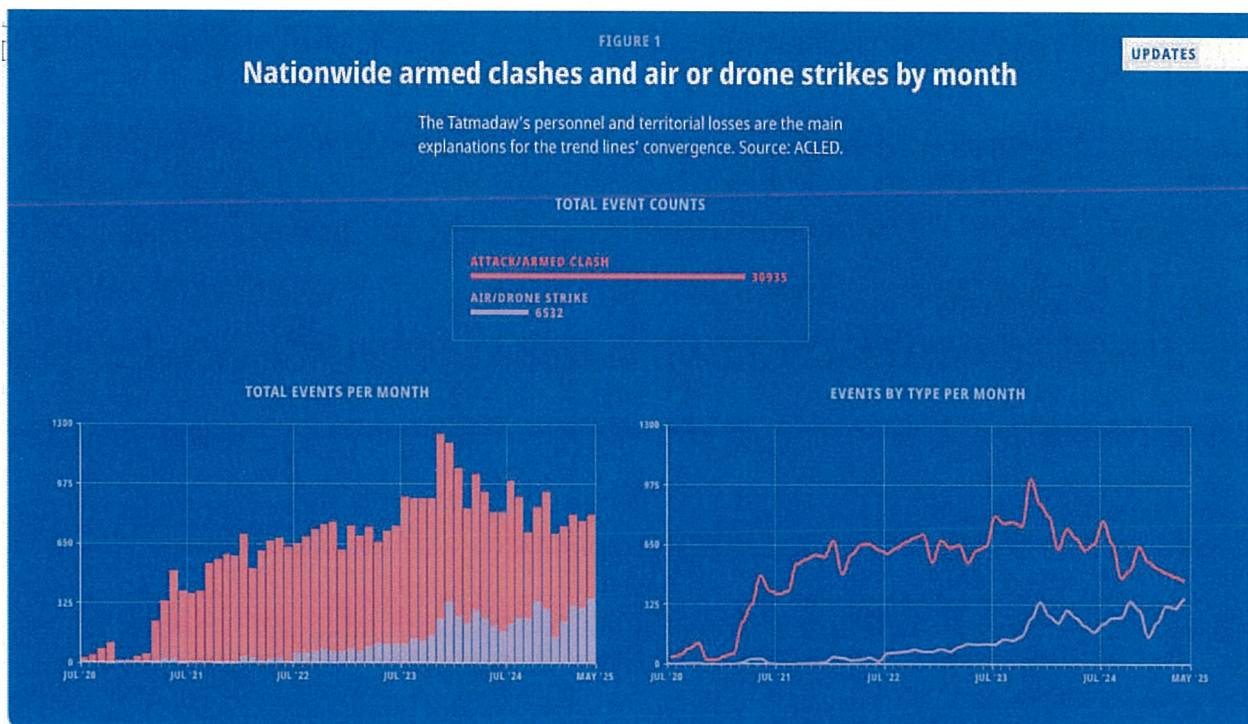
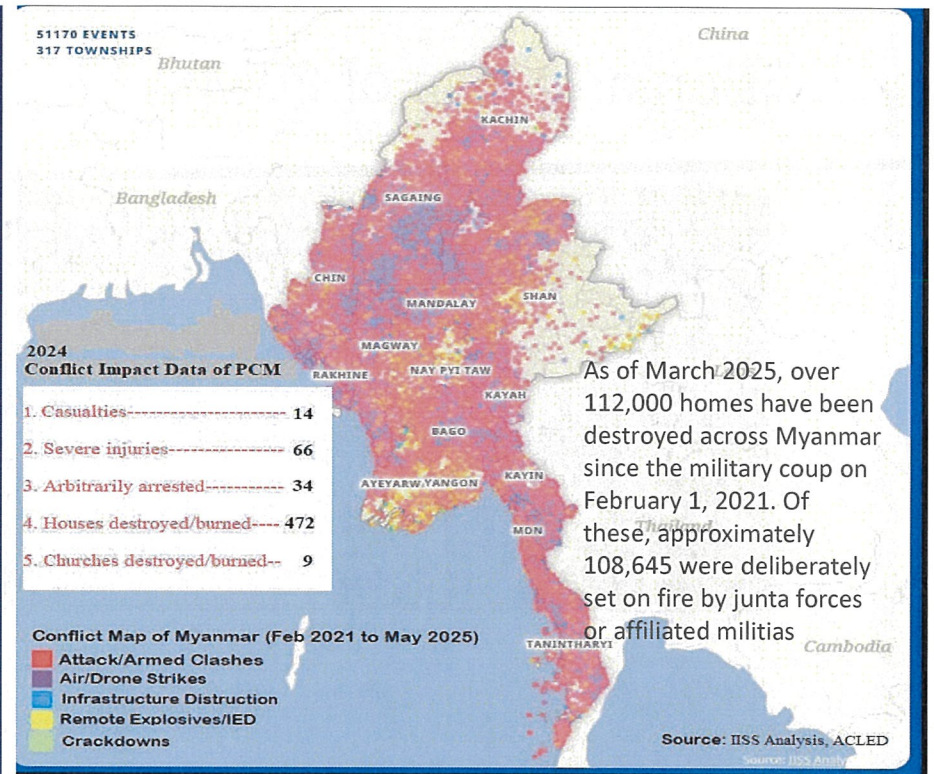


Humanitarian Reality

- **Over 2 million people** have been internally displaced, many forced to flee with nothing but what they can carry.
- Access to food, medicine, and clean water remains severely restricted in many areas.
- The **recent earthquakes**, particularly in Chin and Sagaing regions, have worsened the humanitarian situation—toppling already fragile structures and spreading fear and loss.
- Many **church buildings** and schools have been destroyed, and some pastors and Christian workers have lost their homes and families.

Responses to the Crisis

- PCM shows compassionate actions towards refugees, casualties, injuries, arbitrarily arresting and property lost because of armed clashes and sabotaging.
- PCM's Healing Department takes significant actions through Agape Hospital and also opened Sub healthcare center in remote area. Praying and working for its relocation.
- With the funding from CWM and partner churches PCM managed to welcome refugees time to time and also conducted pastoral visit to 447 migrant and IDP families on Indian border and doing pastoral visits to the congregations which needed to make services in their respective places.
- Responding Educational crisis, PCM has been working with Christian Organizations and supporting Church and community based schools and organizing training for teachers. MCI of CWM and Barnabas Aid are very significance for this work.
- With Solidarity and Action Grant from CWM, an emergency medical response team is formed and it is equipped with first aid training and first aid facilities.
- With the solidarity grant from Partner Churches: like PROK and URC, PCM is encouraging and solidifying weaker synods and affected members.

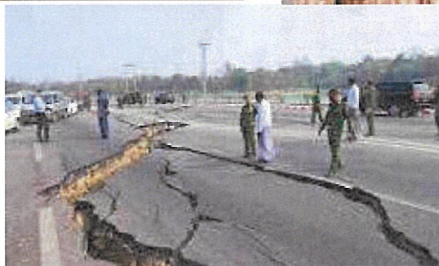

Approximately 10,197 households were rendered homeless. About 47,451 people are taking refuge in relief camps.

Earthquake impact on PCM's Property

1. Huge Cracks in north corner wall of Pastor's quarters.
2. Deep-well damaged
3. Missionary Training Center Building wall collapsed.
4. Church Building ceiling collapsed and fell down.
5. Corner house in the south-east side, all doors and windows fell down
6. The North-west corner house's walls and ceiling collapsed.



PCM's Response to the Earthquake

Emergency Executive Meeting was convened and implemented:

- 10 million Kyat has been given as emergency relief work through reliable NGOs.
- PCM center Mandalay has been set aside for relief camp and welcomed victims.
- Water and toiletries, and lights for victims were arranged.
- "An appeal for funds has been made to local and international churches and organizations. CWM also did it on our behalf.

On going works and works that need to be done

On going works (Under construction)

- Digging dip well at PCM Center Mandalay for water. Digging of deep-well (4 inch x 480 ft) is now completed; fixing water tank and plumping is still needed.
- Repairing and renovating of cracked walls, ceiling, doors and windows panes.

Works to be done

- Demolishing & rebuilding of Mission Training center building
- Rebuilding of Student Boarding house

- Despite the suffering, the Church in Myanmar remains faithful.
- House churches are growing in resilience, with believers gathering in tents, jungles, and ruins to pray and worship.
- Youth and lay leaders are rising up to serve communities with courage and sacrificial love.
- Prayer continues—often in whispers, but never in silence.
- We feel the strength of your prayers. They are not distant—they are felt in the courage of pastors who refuse to abandon their flocks, in the songs sung in shelters, and in the tears of hope shared among the suffering.

- **Prayer:** Please intercede for peace, protection, and restoration. Pray for displaced families, Children Education, traumatized Youth and Children, Agape Hospital, and wounded people.

- **Church Rebuilding:** We are beginning efforts to rebuild places of worship and community centers, not just physically, but spiritually.
- **Advocacy:** Speak on behalf of the people of Myanmar in your churches, governments, and media. Let the world not forget our suffering.
